#### **INTRODUCTION**

NBNC1204 Clinical Practice 10 is based on General Practicum focusing on Professionalism and Issues in Nursing B that is implemented in the student's own ward or area of practice. You will continue to work in your organization and your official working hours will be considered as practicum hours. Your learning will take place as you work because you need to apply more of the theory that you have learnt into your work tasks. You **DO NOT** need a Clinical Preceptor in the clinical practice.

You need to be SELF-DIRECTED in implementing your learning activities with support from your face-to-face tutor and eTutor for the subject of NBBS1203 Professionalism and Issues in Nursing B.

#### **SYNOPSIS**

This course is implemented fully online. It is the practical component of NBBS1203 Professionalism and Issues in Nursing B. It is aimed to enhance students' knowledge and skills related to professionalism and significant issues in nursing practice. This will help students to appropriately apply the related theories into practice during their regular tasks / clinical experiences.

#### Synopsis:

Central to the professional nursing practice is the ability of the nurse to think critically through the application of knowledge and experiences, problem solving and decision making skills. Nurses use elements of reasoned thinking to meet the standards for intellectual thought which must be motivated to develop through the attitudes and dispositions of a fair-minded thinker. It is important that nurses possess attitudes that are generally commendable and foster improvement in service delivery. This must be seen in the thoughts, speeches and actions of the nurses.

#### Requirement:

Critically discuss strategies to promote professional competency in nursing practice through critical thinking skills.
