ASSIGNMENT QUESTION

Written assessment (there are seven questions in this assignment, answer **FIVE** questions ONLY. **10 marks each**. Each essay must contain approximately 500 words).

- 2. Nowadays, many students decide to further their study abroad; what are the benefits and drawbacks of studying abroad. To what extent do you agree or disagree with this statement?
- 3. As mass communication and social network continue to grow, societies are becoming more and more alike leading to a phenomenon known as globalization. Some people fear that globalization will inevitably lead to the total loss of cultural identity. What are your thoughts on the above statement?
- 4. Problems with environmental pollution have become so serious that many countries are trying to solve these problems. Suggest possible solutions and give your own opinion.
- 5. Global warming is one of the most serious issues that the world is facing today. What are the causes of global warming and what measures can governments and individuals take to tackle the issue?
- 6. Is freedom of speech necessary in our society? Give reasons for your answer and include any relevant examples from your own knowledge or experience.
- 7. In many countries it is now illegal to smoke in public places. It is only fair that people who wish to smoke should have to leave the building. Do you agree or disagree?
